Many Ways We Can Help...

I am thrilled to share with you that ARC Broward has several different service and support programs that you may be eligible for and interested in enrolling in! These programs have funding sources (so that the cost to your family will be minimal, if at all). Below are the services and supports offered through the Children's Division:

Respite Care: Our trained staff can provide care and supervision to your child in your home and at our campus so that you can get a well-deserved (and needed) break. (contact Tonya Ricker at 954-577-4109)

In-home Behavior Analysis Services: If your child is engaging in some behaviors that you are concerned about, our Behavior Specialists can come to your home and work with you to help you learn to how to change your child's behaviors (reduce or eliminate the problem behavior and replace with more appropriate behaviors). (contact Patty Eberhardt at 954-577-4171)

Parents as Teachers (PAT): Our Nationally Certified Parent Educators provide in home parent education and support by implementing the award winning PAT curriculum that teaches parents simple and easy activities to improve child development and parent knowledge and skills. The program also includes family group meetings (to meet other families and have fun together) and linkage to community resources to meet family needs (i.e. housing, food, employment, etc.). Preschool: The ARC Broward Early Intervention Preschool Program provides critical education and therapy services to children ages 18 months through five years by a team of Licensed Physical and Occupational Therapists, Licensed Speech Language Pathologists, Board Certified Associate Behavior Analysts and Certified Teachers. The school day begins at 9am and ends at 3pm (early and late care available). (contact Jane Moreno at 954-746-9400 ext 1681)

Rehab Services: Our licensed pediatric therapists assess each child's developmental needs, set appropriate goals, and create an individualized intervention plan. Working together, the team coordinates care for children with multiple needs among their physical, occupational, and speech therapies (contact Ellen Garrett at 954-746-9400 ext 1241)

ABLE (after school program): The *Alternative Behavioral Learning Environment (ABLE)* is a specialized, therapeutic program that provides behavior intervention for children between the ages of 3 and 21 who are unable to stay at home after school and on non-school days (i.e. teacher workdays, winter and spring break) without significant family disruption and who have Developmental Disabilities and behavior issues. Community Mental Health Center: Our therapists provide individual, group and family counseling. We also provide Psychiatric Assessments and Medication Management. Our Psychiatrist and Therapists specialize in provision of these services to individuals with Developmental Disabilities and their family members. (contact Desire Hill at 954-577-4113)

Planning for Kindergarten

Believe it or not, we are already beginning the process to enable our matriculating to kindergarten students (five years of age by September 1, 2010) to seamlessly begin their kindergarten year. Here are some of the steps we will be taking.

Some of the children will be re-evaluated in order to provide us with the most up-to-date information that is needed to consider appropriate placement options.

ARC staff will meet with Broward School Board staff to find out "what is out there" in each area for each child.

Parents will be sent a letter listing placement options to go out and visit. Since the parent is an important part of the team that will meet to consider which placement is the most appropriate for each child, it is strongly suggested that the parent visit the school (s) listed, meet school personnel, and ask questions.

Each parent will be invited to a meeting, probably in the spring, to discuss the placement options and help decide which one is best for their child. It is important for parents to remember that these meetings are scheduled well in advance with very busy Broward School Board staff who travel all around the county. It is usually difficult or impossible to reschedule these meetings once they are set up so we ask our parents to be very flexible when these meeting dates are sent home.

Transition activities will be done with the children to help them transition to their new school.

Feature Program: Parents as Teachers (PAT)

The *Parents as Teachers (PAT) Program* supports parents in their role as their child's first and most influential teacher, since the first few years in a child's life are crucial to his or her development. PAT is a best-practice curriculum which was designed by a team of neuro-scientists, therapists, teachers, and parents to increase parent knowledge of child development and appropriate ways to stimulate their children's intellectual, language, social and motor development, increase parent feelings of competence and confidence, enhance parent-child interaction, strengthen family relationships, communication, supervision and discipline skills, and provide early detection and intervention for developmental problems. **ARC Broward** is the first organization in the country to adapt the PAT curriculum to children with special needs? The ARC Broward PAT program is a replication of the Missouri-based Parents as Teachers Program, a national award winning non-profit parent support and education organization. ARC's PAT program serves Broward County families who have children, from birth through seven years of age, with an established condition, developmental disability, developmental delay/high risk factors for developmental disability/delay, behavioral disorder, emotional disturbance and/or a learning disability.

The PAT Program receives funding through the Children's Services Council of Broward County and the United Way of Broward County. Parents are charged a nominal fee based upon a sliding scale. This year our PAT program had the privilege of providing services to families of 370 children! Through a very impressive expansion award by the Children's Services Council, ARC will service families of 430 children this coming year!

Feature Program: Parents as Teachers (PAT)

Puzzle Play

Simple puzzles offer opportunities for your child to develop skills and pathways in her brain that will lay a foundation for math and language learning to come. When playing with a commercial (store-bought) puzzle or one made from items around your home, your child is learning important thinking skills.

Your Child is learning

- That a whole is made up of parts
- To solve simple problems
- To see and feel differences in shape, size, and color.
- To match or pair objects. She will need to understand that only one puzzle piece can fit into one matching hole before she can begin to pair one number with one object (counting)
- To control the small muscles in her hands
- To be successful and complete a task

Ways to help

- Cut a cereal box or a foam placement into 2 or 3 parts for them to put together
- Ask open-ended questions such as "Where could you put this piece?"
- Point out "clues" using words such as small, bumpy, round, blue, etc.
- Offer inset puzzles with simple shapes that are purchased or made from shoebox lids and containers
- Consider gluing knobs such as thread spools, Furniture handles or game pieces. Onto flat puzzle pieces to encourage your child to use her Fingers.
- Notice when your children struggle and simplify the task by giving her puzzles with less complicated shapes or fewer pieces. Praise all efforts!

Remember, as with any new items, your child needs to explore a puzzle in many ways to learn about it. Let her dump, stack, and rearrange the pieces any way she wants to. She may need to watch you put the puzzle together a few times. Later she will be ready to try fitting pieces into the matching spaces themselves.
